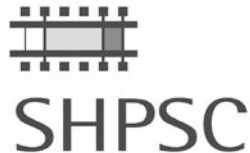

- Setting-up of a Free Press Agency and an independent web-based media outlet to produce information about neighborhood current events.
- Organizing direct action : the “redevelopment” of a vacant lot into what is now the Jardin de la liberté; creation of several urban art pieces
- Setting-up and supporting autonomous projects or committees: the Autonomous Social Center and the Nordelec Resistance Committee (CRAN).
- Participation in activities organized by neighbourhood groups: the struggle against the plans to move the Casino, to close the local post-office ; neighbourhood consultations (OPA) on urban development in general and specifically on the CN rail yards ; public assemblies on urban issues.
